
Stonebridge Men's Club

Our first meeting of 2024 featured local historian John Katerba of the Monroe Township Historic Preservation Commission. John was an articulate, enthusiastic and humorous presenter who spoke about and displayed many 19th and 20th century photos on the history of Monroe Township. He began by mentioning that Stonebridge was built on part of the Dey farm. His fascinating presentation highlighted numerous notable historic events including an annual ice house beginning in 1905 carved out of an icy Thompson Lake that was held for shipping to the Jersey Shore, Forsgate Airport circa 1930 located at what is now Centre Drive, Continental soldiers in 1778 serving under George Washington sleeping in Monroe the night before the Battle of Monmouth (he slept everywhere!), and James Buckelew, the founder of Jamesburg, who controlled hundreds of acres of cranberries in the area.
